# Finding What You Need

- Find It @ MU
  - When coming from a database (PubMed; Scopus; CAB; etc.), the Find It @ MU button will: link you to the full-text if available; search the MERLIN catalog for a print copy; provide a link to Interlibrary Loan/Request a Copy
  - Article in print in a campus library? Choose "Request a Copy" from the Find It @ MU menu, and we'll scan and send it to you for free.
  - In your Google Scholar settings, choose University of Missouri as a "Library link" so that you see the Find It @ MU button on your GS results page
- Off-campus access
  - Start from a Libraries page. You'll be asked to-log in with your PawPrint.
  - Use VPN
  - Install the Google Scholar plug-in

## It's All about Scholarly Communication...

- Looking for a place to submit a manuscript? Do a subject search in Scopus or Web of Science and check Source Title info. Or enter your title and abstract into Elsevier's Journal Finder (http://journalfinder.elsevier.com/) for suggestions. Or ask me!
- Is it legit? **Think.Check.Submit** (http://thinkchecksubmit.org) has a great checklist on how to evaluate journals and avoid predatory publishers.
- Journal-level metrics (e.g., Journal Impact Factor) vs. Article-level metrics (e.g., altmetrics). Be a wise consumer of metrics.
- SHERPA / RoMEO: http://www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/ lists the copyright policies / open access options for a plethora of publishers and journals
- Data Management Plans: http://libraryguides.missouri.edu/datamanagement
- ORCID: Open Researcher and Contributor ID. http://orcid.org Claim your stuff!
- iThenticate: text recognition software (aka plagiarism detection tool) now available for MU faculty & staff to prescreen articles and grant proposals. http://research.missouri.edu/ospa/ithenticate

- **FREE** to students and to interns and residents *who are registered for courses*. Download via DoIT's MyServices: https://myservices.missouri.edu/Login.aspx
- Manage your citations; create bibliographies
- Cite While You Write
- EndNote Guide available at: http://libraryguides.missouri.edu/endnote

## PubMed

- 27 million+ citations from MEDLINE and other life sciences journals. Some biology journals selectively indexed. Part of National Center for Biotechnology Information (NCBI).
- Access PubMed from a library page to see the FindIt@MU information (i.e., don't go straight to http://pubmed.gov). "Available at MU" filter includes our electronic and print holdings
- Most powerful searching
  - MeSH (Medical Subject Heading)
  - Automatic Term Mapping (check the Details)
  - Related Articles
  - Clinical Queries
- Most current (updated daily)
- MyNCBI account to set filters; save searches; create email alerts
- Find journal abbreviations via Journals in NCBI Databases

#### Scopus

- 50 million+ citations from over 21,000 journals. Covers Life Sciences; Health Sciences; Physical Sciences; Social Sciences. 100% MEDLINE coverage.
- Includes times cited and h-index information
- Quickly see an article's bibliography—can follow the Findlt@MU links from the bibliography
- Target potential journals for manuscript submission

## Web of Science Core Collection

- 40+ million citations from 50,000 scholarly books, 12,000 journals and 160,000 conference proceedings. The AAU uses WoS data to rank institutions (so...publish in journals included in WoS)
- Includes times cited and h-index information
- Connects to the Journal Citation Reports (JCR), the source of official Journal Impact Factors
- Direct searching of WoS available in EndNote

## CAB

- 11+ million citations of articles, books, book chapters, conference proceedings
- Archive goes back to 1900
- Browse by CABICODE

## Google Scholar [http://scholar.google.com]

- Searches full text
- Cited By information
- EndNote export feature
